 - a. Improvement Ideas:
 - i. Provide restrooms and fresh water in all SLU parks. These basic services would facilitate broader activation initiatives consistent with the SLU community becoming an urban center.
 - ii. Secure private funding to complement SDOT and LCLIP funds.
 - iii. Replace undeveloped paths in Cascade P-Patch with cement walkways. This would integrate Cascade P-Patch and Cascade Park making accessibility consistent and contiguous between the two. It would also reduce the mobility barriers for those who want to garden and for those needing to use wheelbarrows.
 - iv. Improve park maintenance. Example cited for Lake Union Park was dry grass possibly due to faulty irrigation system. Follow on discussion noted that Friends of Lake Union Park are working with Seattle Parks and Recreation on several issues and making progress. Irrigation system defects. Broken planters. Boat pond cleaning. More robust planting program. Also noted, these issues are classified as maintenance not subject to capital improvement funding.

b. Recreation Ideas:

- Improve Denny Park's undulating topography. The current topology renders Denny Park an underutilized space. It is difficult to stage events and to launch robust activation initiatives.
- ii. Add bandshell shelter, specifically to Denny Park. Such an attraction would facilitate events. Volunteer Park is a good example.
- iii. Understand Lake Union Park's need to conform to its maritime covenant. Example, children's play area incorporating boat theme would work. Basketball court not likely to be supported.
- iv. Investigate opportunity to improve play area adjacent Lake Union Park that is on property owned by SDOT. This would not have the maritime restrictions of Lake Union Park.

c. Other Comments:

- Favorite Parks: Times Square NYC, Bryant Park NYC, Park Guell Barcelona
- ii. Park activation goal should be driven by how-to-enjoy, how to be more experiential, not necessarily the "old version of parks". Think MOHAI Neon Garden.
- iii. Parks must be well managed and maintained to be fully utilized. Examples of current challenges include poor maintenance at Lake Union Park and deterioration of the Arboretum.
