

Identified needs

- Improve and develop all ages bicycling connections
- Implement adaptive signal systems on key corridors
- Review curb space needs in NODO, ensure adequate load zones
- Support new east-west connections



Identified needs (cont.)

- Improve transit speed and reliability
- Improve pedestrian access and experience along and across busy streets
- Activate the public realm
- Improve wayfinding in NODO



Prioritizing projects and programs



Draw from plans, community input, and stakeholder and public outreach

Evaluation approach:

- 1. Consolidate projects
- 2. Assess support for guiding principals
- 3. Apply community input
- 4. Develop planning-level cost estimates
- 5. Assess funding opportunities
- 6. Revise list based on Arena FEIS commitments

Review and revise for Final Plan based on community input

City Transportation Fund

- Community priorities above and beyond SEPA mitigation
- \$40M from OVG
 - ~\$1M/year over 39 years
 - Explore financing and leveraging options
